(b) These estimates are subject to change. They are based on a 9/14/05 e-mail from Ron Munia, Office of Refugee Resettlement, US Department of Health and Human Services. Since California has received 37% of US-bound Hmong refugees since 6/04, CDHS estimates that California will receive 37% (or 480) of the 1,300 refugees remaining in Thailand as of 9/14/05. County estimates were derived by applying the percent from column 3 to the projected total remaining to be resettled.

[d] Refugee Health Services refers to counties receiving local assistance from CDHS Refugee Health Section.

[f] Hmong Health Services refers to a CDHS Refugee Health Section arrangement of Fee for Service payment per refugee health assessment.

[g] COHS=County organized health system: all Medi-Cal Beneficiaries required to enroll (8 counties).

[h] GMC=Geographic Managed Care: enrollment mandatory for children and families (2 counties).
